All About Attitude

"The way you say 'representative' to an automated system reflects the real you," a friend told me. After we laughed at that truth, I realized everything I say matters. Someone is always listening, whether the words and tone are positive or negative.

Ephesians 4:29 (NLT) says our language shouldn't be "foul or abusive" but good, helpful and encouraging. Whether I'm peaceful, hurried, joyful, empathetic, frustrated, celebrating or hurting, I can carefully choose my words (and the attitude behind them). When I'm not ready to speak wholesomely, may God shut my mouth. When a friend needs encouragement, may I listen to God's prompting. When I need to confront, may I do so lovingly.

Changing how we think — that is, how we speak to ourselves — can be tough. But God wants to transform our reactions and motives, dispelling pride, a lack of confidence and anxiety. In this new year:

- •I'm alone can become God is with me.
- I can't do this can become Anything is possible with God.
- •I'm failing can become Just because I'm struggling, it doesn't mean I'm failing.
- I'm not enough can become I'm God's beloved child.
- •I'm tired can become God will give me rest.

Don't stop there. Consider the concerns in your heart and let God give you new words and attitudes.

Christian Symbol

NOAH'S ARK — The image of an ark, or boat — often shown with pairs of animals — recalls the story of Noah and the "Great Flood" in Genesis. The floodwaters represent God's judg-



ment on sin, while the ark reminds us of his gracious power to save and redeem. In this account, Christians see a foreshadowing of our baptism into Christ: "And baptism, which [God's rescue of Noah and his family] prefigured, now saves you ..." (1 Peter 3:21, NRSV).

It is located in the 98-year-old former Nottingham Court Hotel.

You may remember that last year the boiler started leaking and was beyond repair. Although they had it replaced, they still need about \$1,700 to pay off the bill in full.

And as we all know, 98-year-old buildings always need something to repair. LRR already has begun to prioritize their list of improvements for 2025.

The Gold Can offering will go towards Lucille Raines' old and new improvements—all for the benefit of their residents. With these improvements, LRR can go back to what they do best—helping residents recover and work towards living independently.

MENS' FELLOWSHIP SCHEDULE IN 2025


We announce a schedule for a MENS' GATHERING through the coming year.
